SAVING BRINTON (2017) - Director of Photography. Saving Brinton is an Oscar qualifying feature-length documentary that tells the story of Michael Zahs and W. Frank Brinton—two men born a century apart, but bound together by small town life and a collection of 4.5 hours of cellulose nitrate film. In 1981, Zahs discovered the rare collection of early films used by Brinton in barnstorming exhibitions that introduced many lowans to the moving picture. Saving Brinton captures this untold story utilizing rare photos and historic documents to paint a portrait of life and leisure in 1900s Washington County. Simultaneously, Saving Brinton follows Zahs' quest to preserve the treasured collection and to recreate the pageantry of the original exhibitions at the world "repremiere" at the historic Ainsworth Opera House. World Premiere at AFI DOCs 2017, DOC NYC, Rotterdam International Film Festival, Edinburgh Film Festival, Jeonju Film Festival.

CITY OF LITERATURE (2012) - Director of Photography. While only a small town in the middle of The United States, Iowa City is one of only three cities the world designated by The United Nations as a UNESCO City of Literature. This 60-minute documentary premiered on Iowa Public Television, The Big Ten Network, and numerous screenings around the Midwest. Won Best Documentary at the Cedar Rapids Independent Film Festival

ABOVE+BEYOND CANCER (2012) - Director / Cinematographer / Editor - Produced 15 part web-series that interwove the story of a group of cancer survivors and advocates as they climbed Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania and Island Peak in Nepal and performed the two highest American Cancer Society Relay for Life events. Climbed and filmed on both of the mountains under technically difficult conditions.
